MARK 16:

14 Later Jesus appeared to the Eleven as they were eating; he rebuked them for their lack of faith and their stubborn refusal to believe those who had seen him after he had risen. 15 He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation. 16 Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned. 17 And these signs will accompany those who believe: In my name they will drive out demons; they will speak in new tongues; 18 they will pick up snakes with their hands; and when they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all; they will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well."

19 After the Lord Jesus had spoken to them, he was taken up into heaven and he sat at the right hand of God. 20 Then the disciples went out and preach<u>ed</u> everywhere, and the Lord work<u>ed</u> with them and confirm<u>ed</u> his word by the signs that accompani<u>ed</u> it. The message was confirmed before A.D. 70. "Speaking in tongues" was a part of that confirmation. There are only **3** examples of speaking in tongues in the history of the New Testament Church, the book of Acts. They are: Acts 2: 1-12 Acts 10: 44-48 Acts 19: 1-7

ACTS 2: 1 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. 2 Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. 4 All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. 5 Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. 6 When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment.	The 12 were given the power to speak in tongues.

The 12 apostles were the only ones speaking in tongues.

ACTS 10:

44 While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit came on all who heard the message. 45 The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astonished that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles. 46 For they heard them speaking in tongues and praising God. Then Peter said, 47 "Can anyone keep these people from being baptized with water? They have received the Holy Spirit just as we have." 48 So he ordered that they be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked

ACTS 11:

The "coming" 15 "As I began to speak, the Holy of the Spirit Spirit came on them as he had come on was unusual. us at the beginning. 16 Then I Peter cites Pentecost as remembered what the Lord had said: the one 'John baptized with water, but you will example be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' 17 So if God gave them the same gift as he gave us, who believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to think that I could oppose God?" 18 When they heard this, they had no further objections and praised God, saying, "So then, God has granted even the Gentiles repentance unto life."

The Cornelius case of tongues was further

proof to the other Apostles at Jerusalem.

ACTS 19:

1 While Apollos was at Corinth, Paul took the road through the interior and arrived at Ephesus. There he found some disciples 2 and asked them, "Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?" They answered, "No, we have not even heard that there is a Holy Spirit." 3 So Paul asked, "Then what baptism did you receive?" "John's baptism," they replied. 4 Paul said, "John's baptism was a baptism of repentance. He told the people to believe in the one coming after him, that is, in Jesus." 5 On hearing this, they were baptized into the name of the Lord Jesus. 6 When Paul placed his hands on them, the Holy Spirit came on them, and they spoke in tongues and prophesied.

The apostle Paul conveyed the gift of tongues to "non-apostles" through the laying on of hands.

Summary:

- 1. How did 1st century Christians receive tongues?
 - A. The Apostles (12), directly from God.
 - B. The first Gentiles, directly from God.
 - C. Others received it from the Apostles.
- 2. Were these "tongues" languages?

In every case. The Greek word for language is always used. The word "unknown" is not in the Greek text and not in most English Bibles. 3. Were tongues a permanent sign of Christianity?

NO!

- A. When the Bible was written, tongues ceased.
- B. When the Apostles and those they had empower died, tongues ceased.
- 4. The PERFECT REVELATION, the Bible, contains signs of Jesus himself and these signs cannot be abused or imitated.

NOT: Tongues so you can believe BUT: A written record so you can believe

JOHN 20:30 —

Jesus did many other miraculous signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. 31 But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.
